Deed Restrictions are on the web page. We will be reviewing them and each board member was asked to review with their manual.

The city of Overland Park and our deed restrictions do not allow utility trailers to be stored on driveways or on lawns without proper screening. This means a berm that hides the trailer from view. If you are in violation of this restriction please make arrangements for the trailer to be parked elsewhere.

Cars parked in driveways for extended periods of time. If a vehicle is in working order and is licensed by the state, being parked for an extended period of time is not a violation of the law.

The annual meeting was received very well with a good turnout of homeowners. If someone would like to be on a committee to help plan this party/meeting next year, it would be appreciated.

A small discussion was had about the possibility of decorating the mailboxes for Christmas next year. Again, comments about this idea are welcome.
